Kenya Triumphs Region IV 2025 Championship



Team Kenya has reaffirmed its dominance in regional amateur golf after securing victory at the 2025 Africa Region IV Golf Championship, edging out rivals Uganda by a narrow two-shot margin. Kenya closed the 3-day championship with a total team score of 642 in a tightly contested battle at the scenic Golf Du Rova Luxury Hotel in Antananarivo.

The national team, comprising John Lejirma, Michael Karanga, Elvis Muigua, and Junaid Ayaz Manji, displayed exceptional skill, determination, and team cohesion to defend the title Kenya claimed last year in Kigali.



A Testament to Preparation and National Excellence

The team credited their success to intensive preparation and structured training sessions held at Windsor Golf & Country Club, under the guidance of Coach Ali Khimji. Weeks of focused practice, course strategy sessions, and team-building contributed directly to the cohesion and competitive edge demonstrated in Madagascar.

John Lejirma (Team Captain) led the entire championship with a superb 7-under-par, reaffirming his status as one of East Africa's most consistent amateurs.



Elvis Muigua delivered a strong finish at +2, showcasing the form that earned him multiple national titles this season.



Junaid Ayaz Manji, making his senior regional debut, impressed with a composed +5, signaling his readiness for top-tier competition and his emergence as a rising star for Kenya.



Michael Karanga, ranked among Africa's leading amateur golfers, closed at +3, offering crucial stability throughout the event.






R&A AHPP TRAINING

Junior Edition



The African High Performance Programme (AHPP) 2025 brought together twelve promising junior golfers for a focused three-day training camp at Thika Greens Golf Resort. Led by R&A coaches and local professionals. **Day One** centred on core fundamentals: swing refinement, mobility, and short-game technique, setting a strong base for the days ahead.

Day Two intensified the pace with CAPTO putting analysis, wedge-play drills, and brief strategic sessions on tournament preparation. The afternoon's range and on-course work offered players a compact but impactful chance to apply these lessons under



Isaac Makokha Claims NCBA Manchester Salver in Remarkable Victory



Isaac Makokha delivered a performance defined by composure, discipline, and quiet authority as he claimed the **2025 NCBA Manchester Salver at Eldoret Club**, one of the most coveted trophies on the Kenya Amateur Golf Championship (KAGC) Series calendar.

Competing against a strong national field from 7–9 November, the Kenya Railway Golf Club golfer, who competes at the highest level despite being deaf, demonstrated remarkable consistency across the three rounds, posting scores of 73, 74, and a closing 71 to finish at +5 overall. On the challenging par-71 Eldoret layout, known for rewarding patience as much as precision, Makokha's steady approach proved decisive, particularly in the final round, where he held his nerve under pressure.

His victory capped a tightly contested championship, with challengers such as Elvis Muigua of Windsor Golf Hotel & Country Club pushing hard throughout the weekend and finishing just one shot behind. Yet it was Makokha's ability to stay composed and minimize mistakes that ultimately set him apart.

Beyond the trophy, the win marked a significant milestone in **Makokha's KAGC campaign**, **earning him valuable ranking points** and reinforcing his status among Kenya's leading amateur golfers. **KGU** continues to play a pivotal role in **developing G4D** golf and nurturing talent in Kenya's amateur circuit, with backing from **NCBA Bank** ensuring **both inclusion and competitive growth**.

For Makokha, Eldoret was more than a win, it was a triumph of perseverance, talent, and unwavering focus, achieved despite obstacles that make his achievement all the more extraordinary.



Yuvraj Rajput continues to mark his rise in Kenyan golf with a **milestone achievement**, recently earning his **World Amateur Golf Ranking (WAGR)** following a strong performance in an amateur tournament, a notable feat for a junior golfer competing against seasoned amateurs.

His breakthrough came after an impressive **second-place finish at the NCBA Uhuru Shield Tournament**, where Yuvraj pushed the competition to a playoff against John Lejirma, the eventual winner and reigning KAGC 2025 Champion. The performance under pressure highlighted his maturity, resilience, and growing presence on the amateur circuit.

Ironically, Yuvraj had previously **claimed victory at the Mt. Kenya Junior Open**, an event that met WAGR standards, but did not earn ranking points as the tournament had not been officially registered as a WAGR event. Rather than slowing him down, the setback only strengthened his resolve.

That determination has now paid off, as **Yuvraj joins the global rankings**, a significant step forward in a promising junior career that continues to gather momentum.

Kenya's rising golf star **Justin Ngeera**, a member of the **Junior Golf Foundation (JGF)** Elite Team and the Kenya National Junior Golf Squad, made history by **winning the 12th Awa Ibraheem Junior Golf Competition at Ikeja Golf Club, Lagos, Nigeria**, held from October 17th–19th, 2025. **Ngeera became the tournament's first-ever international champion**, a milestone that cements his status as one of Kenya's most promising young golfers.

The WAGR-sanctioned event attracted participants from Nigeria, Ghana, and Cameroon, showcasing a competitive field. Ngeera's performance not only secured victory but also earned him a place on the World Amateur Golf Ranking, reflecting his growing consistency and international competitiveness.

In the boys' category, Nigeria's Matthew Ayin finished second, with Uno Ogoh in third, while the girls' divisions were claimed by Akafu Ebehi (14–16) and Josephine Benjamin (12–13).

Speaking after the win, **Ngeera said, "I've been playing golf for seven years. This is my first international win, and I thank God it went well."** The victory also qualifies him for the ISF World School Golf Championship in Morocco next year, highlighting the potential of Kenya's junior golfers to shine on the global stage.

Ngeera's triumph marks another proud moment for Junior Golf Foundation Kenya and the Kenya Golf Union, demonstrating the country's commitment to nurturing talent through structured programs and international exposure.

THE EILEEN BELCHER TROPHY

The 88th edition of the Eileen Belcher Trophy was staged at the Royal Nairobi Golf Club on 6th and 7th September 2025, reaffirming its place as one of Kenya's most established women's golf tournaments.



The annual event brought together 120 lady golfers representing 45 golf clubs from across the country, creating a competitive yet collegial atmosphere over two days of play.

Named in honour of Mrs. Eileen Belcher, the first Chairperson of the Kenya Ladies Golf Union (KLGU) in 1937, the tournament continues to celebrate women's leadership, teamwork, and the enduring traditions of the game. The competition was contested in a 54-hole foursomes match play format, with teams divided into four colour-coded Zones: Red, Yellow, Green and Blue, each comprising clusters of clubs. Three trophies were at stake across the divisions: the Eileen Belcher Trophy (Division A), the Sinclair Quaich (Division B), and the Palmer Cup (Division C). Match wins earned two points, while draws earned one, with the tournament concluding in an awards ceremony and celebratory gathering on Sunday afternoon.

The Red Zone featured 33 women golfers drawn from Karen Country Club, Sigona Golf Club, Thika Sports Club, Kenya Airforce Golf Club, and Central Kenya clubs including Nyahururu, Nyeri and Nanyuki. During the 2025 edition, Coca-Cola supported the Red Zone as the official T-shirt sponsor, with the partnership acknowledged through tournament communications, team imagery, and the awards ceremony.



THE WATC

*In September 2025, the Kenya Ladies Golf Union achieved a remarkable feat by accepting, with only 24 hours to spare, an invitation to the **World Amateur Trophy Championships (WATC) in Singapore, 28th September.***

This was the first time any Sub-Saharan African country outside SA, participated in this prestigious biennial women's team event, first contested in 1966, with a trophy once owned by Tsar Nicholas II of Russia. The team of three players and a manager faced the challenge of selecting players, arranging flights, booking accommodation, and preparing for a tropical course.

Upon arrival, the team faced heat over 36°C, fast, undulating greens, and a stark contrast with other countries' preparation. Most competitors arrived with coaching teams, uniforms, and support staff, while Kenya relied on resourcefulness and grit. Out of 36 teams, only the top ten automatically qualify for the next WATC; most had prepared for years. Kenya had mere weeks.

Practice rounds exposed altitude differences, uneven lies, and unfamiliar conditions. Players self-caddied, read putts, and managed energy under the heat.



On the first day, Kenya faced Scotland and Chile, finishing near the lower end which was a reflection of experience rather than effort. By the second day, the team had improved despite the tropical sun. A thunderstorm prompted a mid-round evacuation, highlighting Singapore's planning and lessons on adaptability.

Despite challenges, the Kenyan squad displayed resilience, courage, and teamwork, competing on a global stage with minimal notice. Their journey demonstrated the country's tenacity, women's leadership in sport, and ability to embrace audacious opportunities, marking a historic milestone for Kenya in international women's golf.



THE EAST & CENTRAL AFRICA ALL AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHY

In October 2025, the Kenya Ladies Golf Union hosted the East & Central All Africa Challenge Trophy (EACAAC) at the Great Rift Valley Lodge & Golf Resort in Naivasha.



The tournament brought together teams from eleven countries; Mauritius, Madagascar, Reunion, Seychelles, Malawi, Zambia, Rwanda, Burundi, Uganda, Tanzania, and Kenya for a week of competitive golf, camaraderie, and cultural exchange.

The EACAAC ran over three days of 54-hole strokeplay, awarding the country-team trophy, individual overall winner, and junior champion. Kenya entered the tournament with a strong squad, building on previous successes, including a second-place finish at the 2023 EACAAC in Rwanda and a third-place finish at the 2024 AACT in Morocco. Standout performances highlighted both experience and emerging talent. Alongside the main championship, supporters' tournaments allowed amateur players to compete at the Great Rift Valley Lodge and Mount Kipipiri Golf Resort.

Participants also enjoyed game drives, cultural visits, and a Kenyan-themed Gala Dinner, culminating in the prize-giving ceremony where Cabinet Secretary Hon. Salim Mvurya, EGH, served as Chief Guest.

The 2025 EACAAC celebrated competition, friendship, and regional collaboration, offering a memorable experience for all and reinforcing Kenya's position as a hub for women's golf in Eastern and Central Africa.

Kisii Sports Club

Adrian assumed office as Golf Captain of KSC in February 2024 and was re-elected in 2025 to continue his leadership. Since beginning golf in February 2016, he has demonstrated remarkable dedication to advancing the sport in the region, combining vision, strategic planning, and a hands-on approach to club management.

Under his leadership, KSC has hosted several milestone events, including the first-ever Rules School Level 1 in the region organized by KGU, the inaugural KAGC Kisii Open – Shabana Trophy in March 2025, the first-ever Ladies GOTY – Western Region in October 2025, and the 1st Western Junior Open, a three-day event held in November 2024. These initiatives have elevated the Club's profile and provided a platform for players across age groups to compete and develop.

Adrian has overseen a significant growth in membership, including an expanding number of ladies and over 40 juniorstraining with support from JGF. He initiated the Western Captains League in 2024, now a robust inter-club competition across six regional clubs, with Kisii emerging champions in 2025.

His tenure has seen major improvements to the course, including the addition of hazards, sand bunkers, extended tee boxes, irrigation systems, bridges, and tree planting, alongside upgrades to equipment such as a new green mower. Plans are underway for a halfway Banda, restrooms, and a caddy shack, reinforcing Adrian's commitment to making Kisii Sports Club a premier golfing hub in the region.

Through his vision, Adrian continues to foster a culture of competition, development, and inclusivity, ensuring the Club thrives as a center of excellence for golfers of all levels.



FR NICHOLAS KAMAU MUGUCU

Nyahururu Sports Club


